	Chairman's Welcome and Public Forum – the Chair opened the meeting and welcomed those present. He thanked the retiring Clerk (Gillian Thompson) for her exemplary service and present her with a Garden Voucher from Members. He then introduced Liz Fellows who will be her replacement.		
	Ms Alison Fogg, of The Gables, Bodinnick spoke regarding Pink Cottage (Minute 20a/2025 below). She supported comments made by the Cornwall National Landscape and said that in her view the proposal would ruin the historic character of the area. A previous application was only permitted as a single storey extension. She believed it was purely about making more money from the sale. She explained the metal pipe is an old water pump, now unused Steve Herbert and his wife from the Ring O Bells spoke regarding his planning application (Minute 20d/2025 below). He said there is a possibility the case officer will object and asked Members to support him in his wish to take this to CC's Planning Meeting. He confirmed it will not be visible from the road and confirmed only natural stone and larch will be used with a slate roof to fit with local vernacular.

	OBJECTION: The proposed development contravenes NDP Policy 1 Design and Character (specifically Policy 1.1.1.2,1.3) Policy 3 Important and special views in Bodinnick and from river Fowey; Policy (detriment of amenity of neighbouring properties) Contravenes CLP Policy 12 and 27. The addition of an extra storey on the newer part of an already extended building will not enhance the surrounding area and will be out of character in terms of mass and bulk and design; the modern extension will be clearly visible compared to the older adjoining cottage and surrounding properties and from the road and the river view. The garden of property behind Pink Cottage will lose amenity due to the additional height. The PC also is concerned that access to the property to enable building work will cause significant issues blocking the road and block access for neighbours; and it is unclear where building materials could be stored.
